GENERAL ITEMS OF DISCUSSION:

- 1) Discussed third and final reading of Ordinance # 5-2017 revising doctor criteria for police pension plan.
- 2) Discussed third and final reading of Ordinance # 6-2017 Ratifying stop signs, speed limits and traffic control devices and signs.
- 3) Discussed third and final reading of Ordinance # 7-2017 Providing for the immobilization of vehicles, towing and storage of vehicles that cause a safety concern.
- 4) Discussed Zachary Shoop's end of probation (August 17, 2017). Mr. Shoop will be extended a job offer.
- 5) Discussed Resolution 4-2017: Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement with New Kensington.
- 6) Discussed reappointing Karen Leslie to the Parks Commission. Mrs. Leslie will be contacted to see if she is agreeable to serving another term.
- 7) Discussed the resignation of George Spiering from Auxiliary Services. Mr. Spiering served with Auxiliary Services and has been a school crossing guard.
- 8) Discussed a possible increase of the deposit fee for Fisher Hall. The increase will cover the cost if there is ever an issue of having to replace the lock when keys are lost or not returned.
- 9) Discussed possible acquisition of property adjacent to City Hall.
- 10) Discussed reappointing Terry Speer to the Police Civil Service Commission. Mr. Speer is fine with being reappointed.
- 11) Discussed Recycling Bid Received.
- 12) Mr. Joe Vincler, 117 Washington Drive, and Mrs. Susan Godfrey, 121 Washington Drive spoke about city sewage backup into their homes when a manhole cover lifted at Washington and Leechburg.
