

The Agenda Meeting of the City of Lower Burrell was held on Monday, September 6, 2022 at 7:00 PM. Roll call indicated the following present: Councilman Stoltz, Councilman Fabry, Controller Farina, Treasurer Eshbaugh, Public Works Coordinator Michelle Hatbob, Mayor Andrejczik, Chief of Police Marhefka, and City Manager Amy Rockwell. Absent was Councilwoman Albanese, Councilwoman Grieff, and Solicitor Yakopec.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1) Engineering Report – Senate Engineering. Mr. Matt Pitsch discussed his monthly report. He discussed a Westmoreland LSA Grant that can be used for a scope of work in the Kinloch Area for a Sanitary Sewer Lining Phase II. The grant requires a resolution and a funding commitment letter.
- 2) Discussed the Alle-Kiski Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement 2022/2023. City Manager Rockwell commented that Lower Burrell's share is \$1,703.99.
- 3) Discussed the purchase of a 2023 Police Interceptor.
- 4) Discussed a proposed ordinance regarding delinquent collections. Treasurer Eshbaugh has researched a collection company that would handle delinquent sewer and recycling accounts. There will be no fees charged to the City.
- 5) Discussed Trick or Treat night. Trick or Treat will be October 31st from 6 to 8 PM. The American Legion 9-11 ceremony will be September 11, 2022 at 9 AM.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

John and Anita Wiehagen, 213 Trailer Blvd. Mrs. Wiehagen discussed the condition of Hill Street and how hard it is to drive on since the water line replacement work. She is concerned about the water running across the road also. Mr. Pitsch was able to report that the contractor will be back to connect the homes to the new line after waiting 30 days to test. Paving will happen after the homes are connected. She also commented on cars along the road and wondered if there was an ordinance covering the situation.

Joe Lepish, 801 Hartge Road was researching California ordinances based on Covid vaccinations.
